Every time a project is finished I feel like saying "Lord let's wait awhile before starting another project". I have learned these past two years that the Lord has His time for everything. If God opens the door and we miss the opportunity, the door may close and not open up again. From the beginning we dedicated Radio Samaritano to the Lord and God has blessed it. Millions of people now have the opportunity to hear the Gospel every day.

Of the many letters that we receive everyday, the ones that touch my heart the most are the letters that pastors write. Many times these men pastor churches in the interior of their country and they write to thank us for the encouragement we give them through Radio Samaritano. This does not only include our pastors but many other pastors in Honduras, El Salvador, and Nicaragua.

For a few months, we have been worried about a certain amount of people who are not able to hear our station. There are about 500,000 people in the rural areas of Honduras who do not have F.M. radios. These people are very poor and they can only afford A.M. Radios. Radio Samaritano has two F.M. stations but we have no A.M. stations. The Honduran Government has given us a permit for the frequency A.M. 1230. They have given us 90 days to go on the air. We can build an A.M. station for \$10,000.00 (dollars.)

We are going to start building the station by **Faith** this month. We only have five hundred dollars to start. I believe that God has opened this door so more people can hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Being poor should not be an obstacle to hearing about salvation.

Please pray that God will provide for this new project. We want to be ambassadors for Christ to the rich and to the poor.

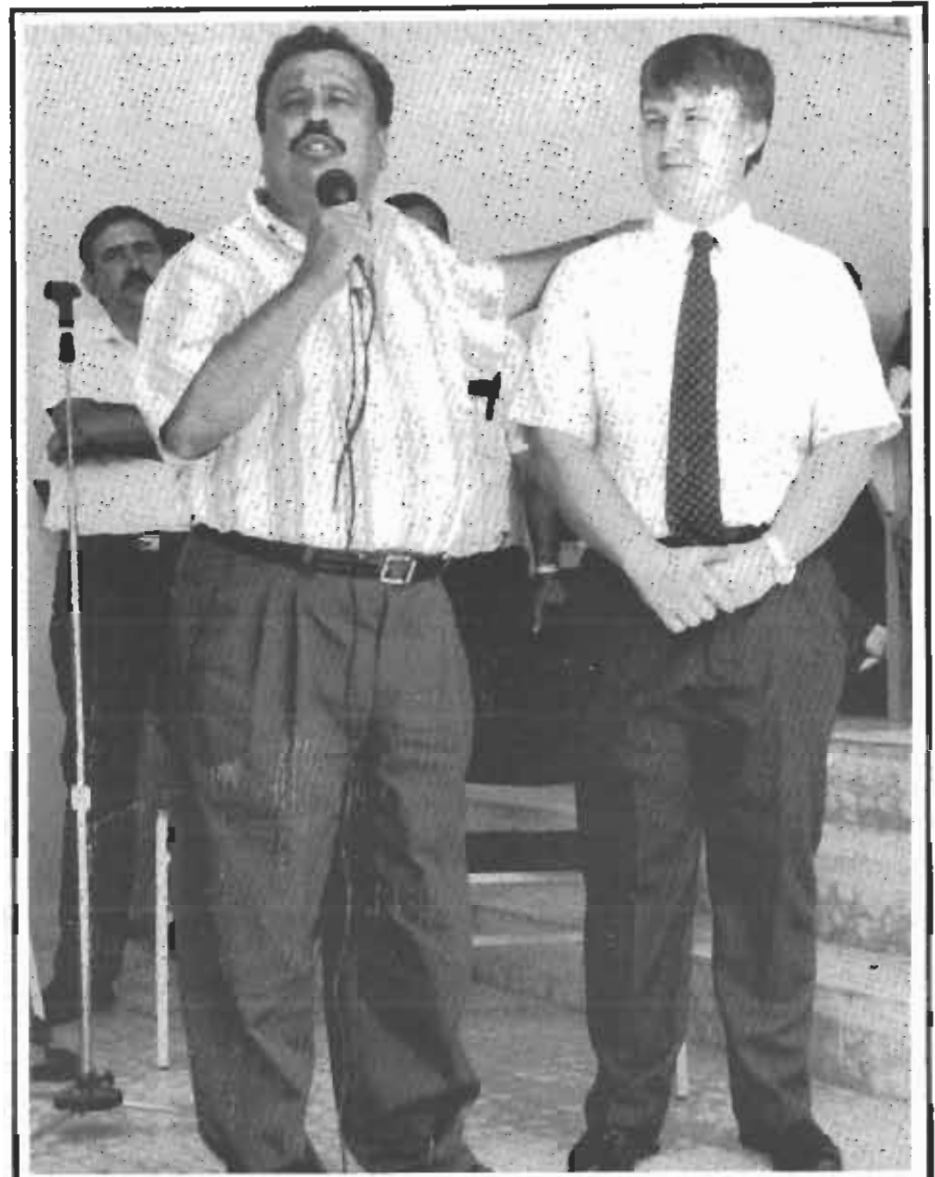

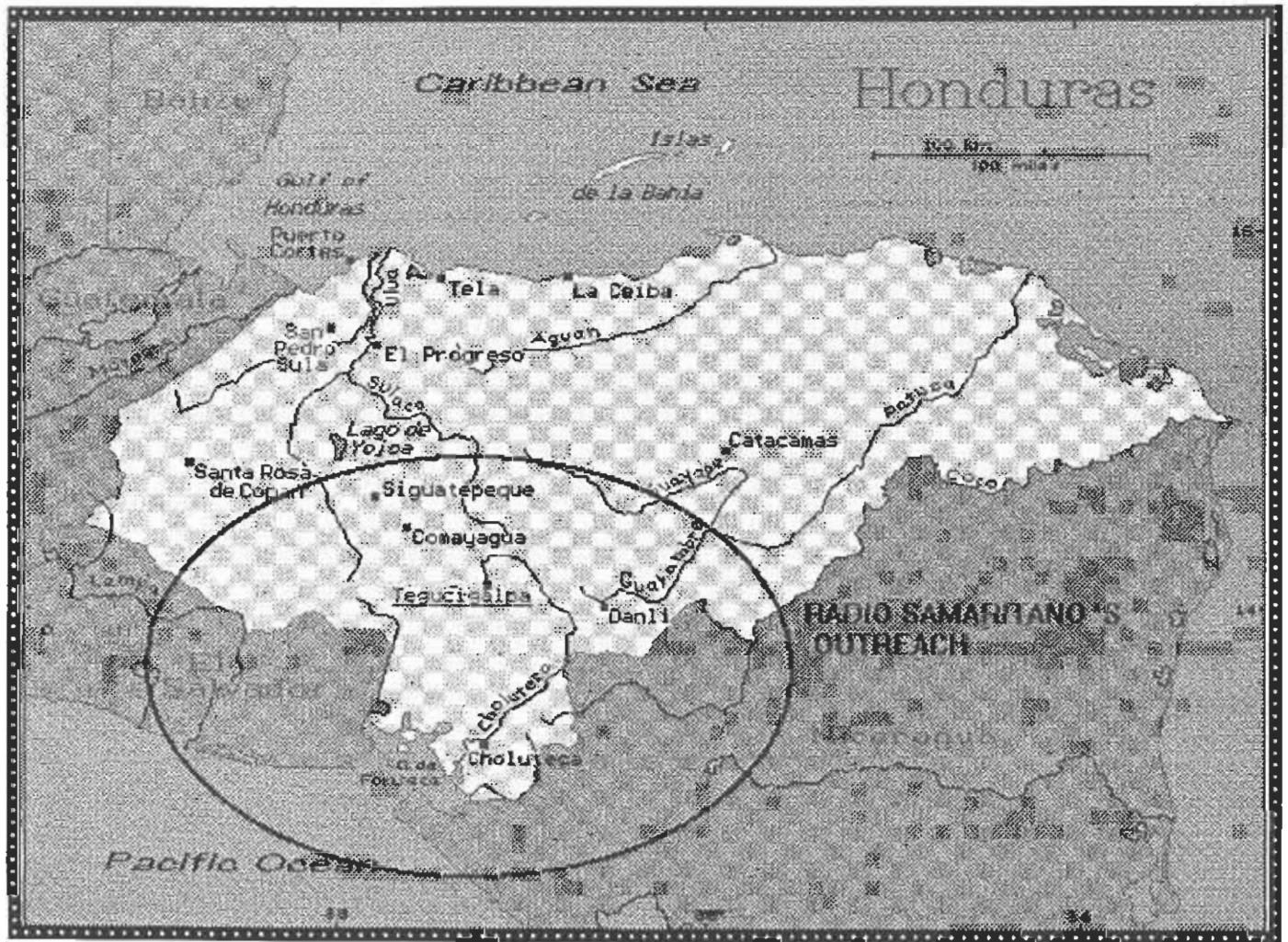

Dear Co-Laborers in Christ,


It is such a blessing to sit down once more and write to you about the blessings that God has shed upon our ministry. Dircia and the children are doing just fine, and I am also in good health.

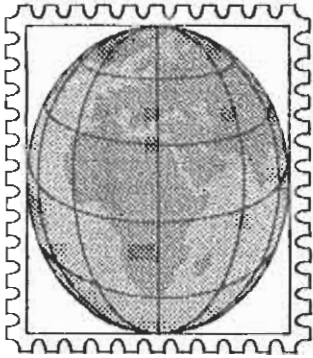

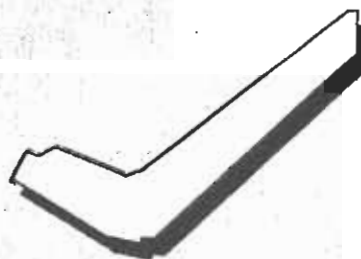

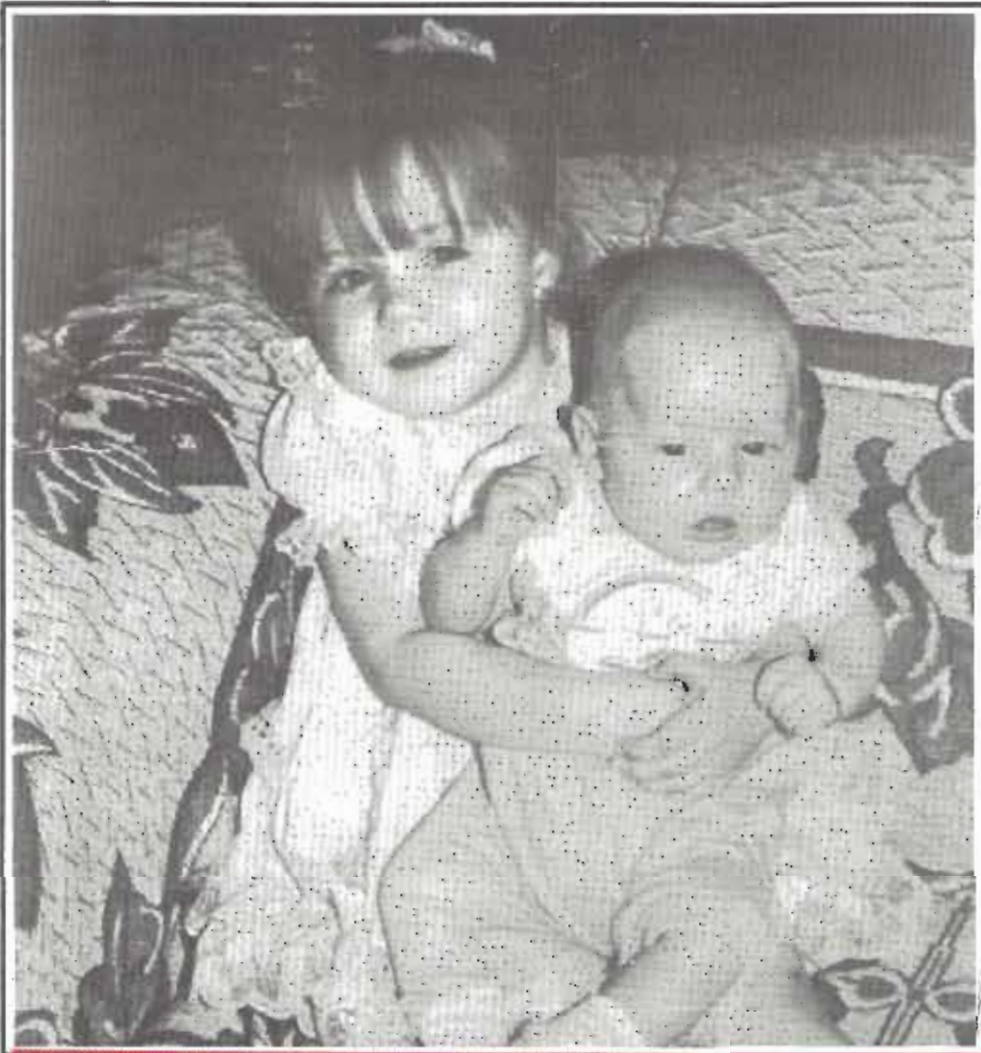
