

Comali Tabernacle and International Bible Institute

Dear Co-Laborers in Christ,

Graduations, constructions, Christmas activities and missionary journeys are just some of the things we want to tell you about in this letter. This letter will be long...but how can we crowd so many of God's blessings into just one page.

The Comali Tabernacle will soon be finished and what a building it is. Since it's right across the highway from where we live, Bob and I sit on the porch and marvel at what God has done. It makes us proud because this is HIS tabernacle and it is so beautiful. The dedication of this building will be the first week in April...the same week the International Bible Instittue will begin. All the churches in Honduras will be there - **WE INVITE YOU TO COME**.

On November 30th, 117 students graduated from our grammar school and on December 1st, the Good Samaritan High School hosted a graduation for 16 Bi-Lingual Secretaries and 36 Bachelor in Computer students. As always for graduations, the buildings were packed with people standing. It was a wonderful time for the Gospel to be preached because there were so many lost people there who came to see their loved ones graduate.

On December 1st, the new church in El Corpus, Honduras, was dedicated. The Holy Spirit could be felt from the time we walked into this church...there was so much conviction throughout the service. It was a blessing to have Sister Anna Beck and her son, Kris, there. Their family raised the money to build this church in memory of their beloved husband and father, Milton Beck - a man who loved missions and is now home with the Lord. There was not even room to stand inside the church and the large porch outside was filled with people looking through the windows. The pastor told us there were people in this service, invited by friends, whom no one thought would ever come to church. But the exciting thing is they have continued to come and many have been saved; others have rededicated their lives. The church is full for every service. Pastor Quinn Evans, along with several of his church members, were also present for the dedication of a new Feed the Hungry Kitchen that Pleasant Grove Baptist Church of Hiram, Georgia, built behind the new church building.

We cannot forget our beloved friend and co-laborer, Brother Doyle Gunter, who purchased all of this property in El Corpus several years ago. Brother Doyle is now with the Lord but truly his works are following him. What a testimony Brother Doyle has left here in Honduras and Nicaragua as everywhere we go we see fruit of his labor.

Christmas is always a busy but exciting time here. It takes us back to our own childhood to see the excitement of the children when they receive a Christmas sack. This year, thousands of Christmas sacks were given out, thanks to the generosity of you who shared with these dear children. The Christmas party for the Elderly touched the hearts of everyone present including our Mayor, Chief of Police and other people from town. Because you gave so generously, these precious old people had more presents than they could carry. As they went out the door, they were treated with a chicken to take home with them. We had asked them to make a list of what they would "like" to have and we were able to fulfill every wish. Some wanted beds, some shoes, some clothes, some blankets - everyone wanted food because they have no food at home. Everyone got a bag of food. I wish you could have been here.

Our family went to the hospital to take presents to the children and it was incredibly SAD...we were taken in a ward where children were almost starved to death. One little hand reached out for a piece of chocolate and after the first bite, the child started vomiting. Once again we realized what a terrible life many of these poor people have - but for a moment there was joy in the faces of the little children as they received their toys and candy. I was so upset I didn't even use the camara I had brought to make pictures.

On January 5th, we attended Bible School Graduation for seven preachers in Nicaragua. At the same time, seven others were ordained. These services were dedicated to Brother Bob Tyson, who brought the Gospel to them so many years ago.

Also in January, we made trips to the back country of Honduras for church dedications. Moralico was a place completely washed away by Hurricane Mitch and other countries helped to build a **New Moralico**. The Mayor gave our mission three pieces of property - we first built a kitchen for the children; then a pastorium where the pastor could live and hold church services; and then, thanks to Ken and Pat Hensley of Virginia, a beautiful church was built. We went there for this dedication, leaving at 3:00pm and returning to our house at 2:00am. Bob was able to go, along with our driver and another man to "protect us" from the road bandits. This was a 4-hour trip "way" back in the mountains. Food was waiting on our arrival and the church was packed with people as usual. *One was saved that night*.

The next morning at 9:00am, we left for another church dedication in Nicaragua in a place called "San Juan de Rio Coco". Bob was still tired from the night before so Luz, our housekeeper, and two preachers went with us. The trip was fine until we came to this huge river to cross and there was NO BRIDGE. All I could think about was "the trip back in the dark crossing this river". *Two ladies were saved on that day*.

We know this news will be a blessing to those of you who have visited the community of La Quesera, Honduras. A revival is going on here - 40 souls have been saved in the past month and someone has already given land for a church. One hundred forty-five people crowded in and around the little house where they were meeting last week.

To Everyone Who Has Given to Help Buy the New Equipment for the Radio Station in Casa Blanca, Honduras...We Want to Express Our Deep Gratitude. All we can continue to say is GOD IS SO GOOD. At the same time the Government gave a permit for an increase in power in Casa Blanca, they also gave a permit to increase the power in the AM station in Choluteca. Not only did enough come in for this equipment in Casa Blanca, would you believe that enough moncy has been received to buy a new and more powerful transmitter for this station also. So many of you heard the testimony of the woman, Maria, who called from El Salvador begging for the radio never to be taken off the air because in the community where she lives; she, her husband and another family had been saved. She said Samaritan Radio was the only radio that entered this far away community. When the idolatrous community refused their witness for Christ, her husband bought a loudspeaker, put it in a tall tree outside their house overlooking the community and they played Samaritan Radio all day long. When evil men came to take the loudspeaker down, they found the tree filled with "killer bees" and they had to flee.

NOW FOR AN UPDATE - Our pastor, Efraim Sandoval, went to this little community in El Salvador. This trip took 4 hours by bus after he reached the border. He found Maria Consuelo Venturo and the other Christians. He took Bibles to them and that night he preached in the park. They have no church but now three more are saved. The loudspeaker is still in the tree but the killer bees are gone. No one has threatened to take the loudspeaker out because they fear what the Lord may do and they continue to play the radio to the village. They asked for our preachers to come and have a campaign in the village. They said they would supply all the food and a place to stay. Just as this story touched many hearts to help us pay for the equipment, we pray it will touch hearts to support Samaritan Radio on a monthly basis. Only God knows the outreach of Samaritan Radio.


In closing this long letter, we just want to say thank you from the bottom of our hearts for your support, your love and your prayers during times that have been very hard for us...especially with Bob's sickness. But we haven't slowed down one minute and there is an urgency to work harder than ever. **Now we are endeavoring a NEW ministry and we need your SUPPORT more than ever**. This is the International Bible Institute that will begin

on April 1st in the new Comali tabernacle. We are expecting some 40 young preachers to come from Nicaragua and Honduras to study. There is nowhere for these preachers to work and the Lord has laid it on our hearts to get support for them just as we do in the children's ministry. You can adopt a student and this money will go to provide for that student and his family while he is studying. You will have a great part in the preparation and training of a young preacher and every place he goes to preach you will share in the fruit of his ministry. It's going to take a lot of food and money to run this Bible Institute on a full-time basis, but just as God has always provided everything we have needed for His work, we are trusting Him to provide for this Bible Institute so that the Gospel of Jesus Christ will continue to be preached in every town, village and community. We will send you a picture of the student or students and you will be able to communicate with them on a monthly basis, sharing in everything they do for the Lord as they study HIS WORD.

Forgive us for this long letter, but these are exciting days here with so much happening. We thank you from the bottom of our hearts for your love, prayers and financial support.



There was a service held on the lot giving thanks to the Lord for His BLESSINGS.







We had to cross the Coco River on our way to San Juan. There was no bridge.






What a wonderful time for teenagers to come together and learn of God and sing His PRAISES!


